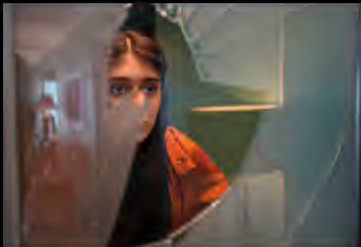

This screening will include an Introduction and Musical Performance led by Dr. Hwee-San Tan, Associate Lecturer in Ethnomusicology at Goldsmiths, University of London, and Research Associate at SOAS University of London. Dr. Tan leads the SOAS Chinese Music Ensemble and Chinese Percussion Society, together with Mr. Ying Wan, specialist in Chinese instruments, composer and arranger.





When the hapless Sing (Stephen Chow) and his dim-witted pal, Bone (Feng Xiaogang), try to scam the residents of Pig Sty Alley into thinking they're members of the dreaded Axe Gang, the real gangsters descend on this Shanghai slum to restore their fearsome reputation. What gang leader Brother Sum (Danny Chan) doesn't know is that three legendary retired kung fu masters (Yu Xing, Dong Zhihua, Chiu Chi-ling) live anonymously in this decrepit neighbourhood and don't take kindly to interlopers. From wildly imaginative Kung Fu showdowns to dance sequences featuring tuxedoed mobsters, we've never seen action this outrageous and characters this zany! With jaw-dropping fight sequences by Yuen Wo Ping (famed action choreographer of *Crouching Tiger, Hidden Dragon* and *The Matrix*) Stephen Chow (director and star of *Shaolin Soccer*) is a real force to reckon with, in this action-packed, comedic martial-arts adventure.

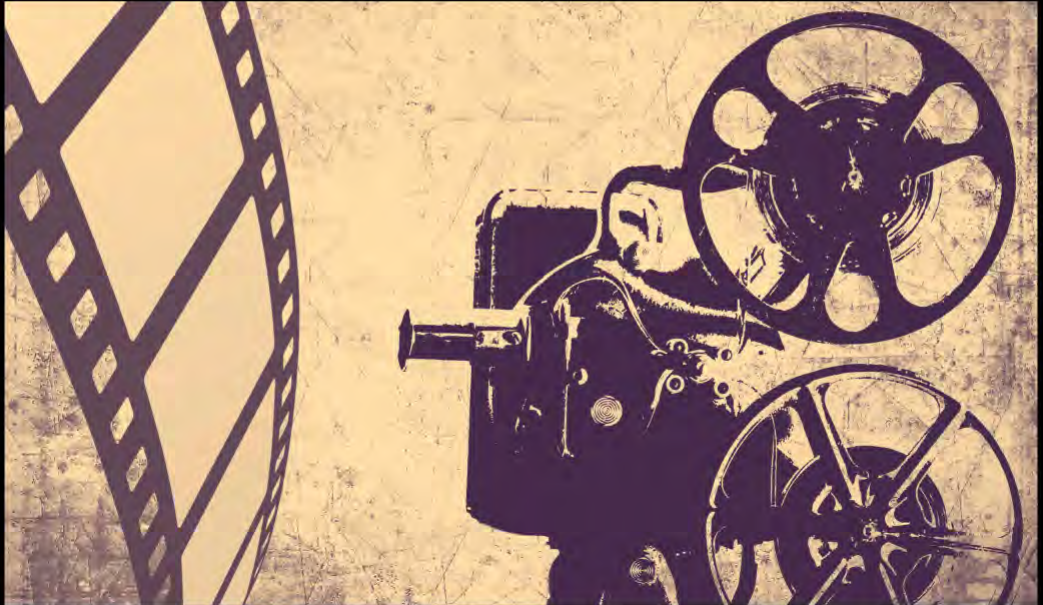

Special Presentation

Our Screen Heritage: Archive Film Screenings & Discussion



Showcasing a series of rarely-seen archive films that span over a century, and focus on themes of Colonial and Post-colonial India, birth of Pakistan, and the 50th Anniversary of the arrival of Ugandan Asian refugees in Britain, this programme aims to reflect upon the collective screen heritage of the South Asian and Ugandan Asian communities in the British National and Regional Archives.

Supported by Film Hub North, this event is an attempt to engage the audiences in a constructive and insightful dialogue about the legacy of the Empire, following 75 years of Indian independence from the Colonial rule on August 15, 1947. Sadly, freedom from 200 years of British tyranny came at a heavy cost and led to the greatest humanitarian crisis of the 21st century in the Indian subcontinent, causing the partition of India, the subsequent birth of Pakistan (August 14, 1947), and the creation of Bangladesh (March 26, 1971).

2022 also marks the 50th anniversary of the arrival of nearly 27,000 Ugandan Asians in Britain as refugees after being expelled by president Idi Amin. 50 years on, the Ugandan Asian community has gone on to thrive and emerge as one of the most inspiring success stories from the Indian diaspora in Britain.

75 Years On: India Through the Lens of the Empire [1899-1947]

Synopsis: Drawn exclusively from the BFI National Archive, *Around India* features some of the earliest surviving film from India as well as gorgeous travelogues, intimate home movies and newsreels from British, French and Indian filmmakers. Taking in Maharajas and Viceroys, fakirs and farmhands and personalities such as Sabu and Gandhi, Sandhya Suri's film explores not only the people and places of over 70 years ago, but asks us to engage with broader themes of a shared history, shifting perspectives in the lead up to Indian independence and the ghosts of the past.

Around India boasts a superb new score that fuses western and Indian music from composer and sarod player Soumik Datta.

The Bloody Road to Freedom: Partition of British India and the Birth of Pakistan [August 14, 1947]

Synopsis: From the sight of the Pak Mail Express steaming out of Karachi station en route for Lahore and Peshawar, to the border patrols in the mountain passes of Kashmir, this positive appraisal of Pakistan presents a picture of a modern nation with deep-rooted ancient traditions. Doctors, scientists and teachers live in a country where white oxen plough fields and chapatis are cooked on stones in villages where headmen still settle local disputes.

This March of Time film accurately portrays the Pakistan of 1950 as a pluralistic new country: culturally diverse and outward looking but deriving unity and purpose from its Muslim heritage. The emphasis on a free press, education, industrialisation and footage of the new airport at Karachi contrasts with the rural lifestyle of most of the country's inhabitants. The political uncertainty that characterised Pakistan in the 1950s is hinted at by the film's sections about the dispute with India over Kashmir. Footage of a meeting between the Prime Ministers of both countries - Jawaharlal Nehru and Liaquat Ali Khan - shows how relations had improved following the Indo-Pakistan war of 1947-48.

Perhaps Renoir's most symbolic and spiritual film, displaying great humanity and refreshing simplicity, *The River* received tremendous international acclaim and remains one of his most popular films.

Artists in the Spotlight: Eelyn Lee and Anamaria Marinca Film Screenings + Q&A



Eelyn Lee's socially engaged practice combines collective research, devised theatre, screen writing and filmmaking to create frameworks for ensembles of collaborators to work together. Her Chinese/English heritage motivates her interest in race, identity and 'othering'. She has exhibited across UK including Barbican, Tate Modern, National Portrait Gallery and Whitechapel Gallery as well as internationally in Paris, Berlin, Bogotá and Toronto.

Anamaria Marinca is a Romanian actress who made her screen debut with the Channel 4 film *Sex Traffic* for which she won the BAFTA for Best Actress. Marinca is also known for her critically-acclaimed performance in the 2007 Cannes winner, *4 Months, 3 Weeks and 2 Days*, for which she earned several awards. She recently starred in the international horror film, *You Won't Be Alone*, which premiered at the 2022 Sundance Film Festival.

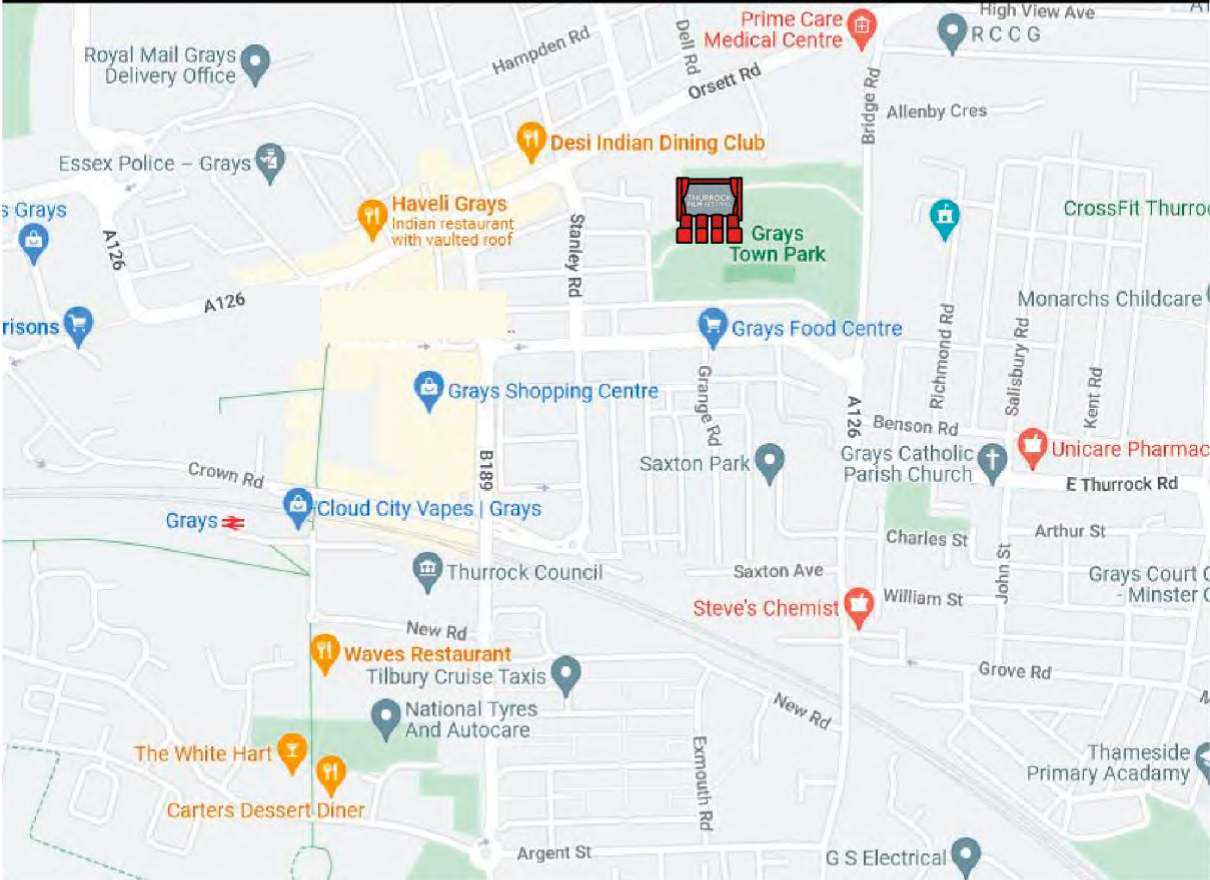
